

Kingdom Mission International - Church Planting Program: as at 18th November, 2014

Kingdom Mission began on 12th January, 2012 with the primary calling and objective of training candidates and supporting them in the ministry of church planting. Our first intake of students commenced at the beginning of September of that year.

From that **first intake** the following students have commenced churches or established outreaches within Myanmar:

Tun Tin Maung - 3 churches in the Rakhine State

Hoe Thang Maung - 1 church in the Rakhine State

Kee Ling - 1 home church in Yangon & 1 outreach in his home village

Pau La - 1 church (with her brother) in the Shan State

Cing Pi - 1 Children's church - Eastern Shan State

Sub total: 8 churches

Second Intake

Robert: 1 church in Kaylat village on the Myanmar/Laos border

Third (Current) Intake

Nein Thang - 1 church established & 1 church soon to commence in the Eastern Shan State.

Total to-date: 11 churches/outreaches.

Bogalay and surrounding villages in the Irrawaddy Delta region

Thalay region,(Three Mountain Village) Eastern Shan State

Yangon in partnership with a local church

Various areas of the **Rakhine State** in partnership with Rhema Church in Yangon

Paletwa: western chin state **of Myanmar .**

Chittagon : Border of Myanmar and Bangladesh

Kalamyo: Sagaing division , Myanmar .

Keng Tung region (Jai Dung), Eastern Shan State

In Thailand:

Next year we will have about 6 or 7 Thai Lisu students, most of whom will plant churches in Thailand from **Chiang Mai** region (Chiang Dao) to and across the **Myanmar border**.

In Laos:

I have a heart to reach Laos people and God has placed one of our graduates in a village of Myanmar located across the river from Laos. Plus I already have a few contacts in Laos so am expecting things to gradually happen here.

In Pakistan:

Nouman, our first Pakistani student, has already recruited 4 or 5 Pakistani's and we are expecting them to join us. We will then have a team for church planting over there.

By the end of 2015 I would be hopeful of about **20** or more churches to be added to our number to-date. That would mean more than 30 churches up and running. Our vision is 1,000 churches in ten years.

To accomplish this will mean more outreach programs happening in the regions God has given us to-date.
